Re: The VET Student Loans (Courses and Loan Caps) Determination 2016

Youth Allowance (student), Austudy, ABSTUDY and Pensioner Education Supplement are <u>now limited</u> to VSL approved awards - Diploma and higher. (As per: Budget 2017-18 Better Alignment of Student Payments).

This decision is unfair and doesn't apply to University courses where freedom to choose a course by the student and not by the Minister.

ASQA states there are approximately 5,000 RTO providers. Yet in 2017* there were only 211 VSL approved RTO's and only 155 RTO's had students who accessed a VET student loan. There are only 384 VSL approved courses out of a total of <u>4138 registered courses</u>.

Students enrolled in full-time in any of the remaining 3,754 non-VSL courses are <u>UNABLE</u> to receive -Youth Allowance (student), Austudy, ABSTUDY and Pensioner Education Supplement.

These students have to pay for the full award costs while at the same time receive no living allowances.

This is unfair and Un-Australian.

I salute this governments decision to increase student payment but it was at the cost of others students.

This is unfair and Un-Australian

This essentially makes all non-VSL awards of lesser value and places courses outside of the financial reach of ordinary Australians.

At minimum <u>all</u> Non-VSL courses should have student payments attached.
